Lay your head down at oceanfront accommodations at Meet Me At Deep Bay.

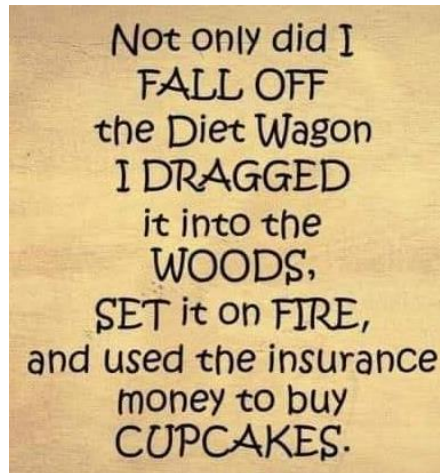
Holidays During a Pandemic

7 Steps to Cold Weather Safety

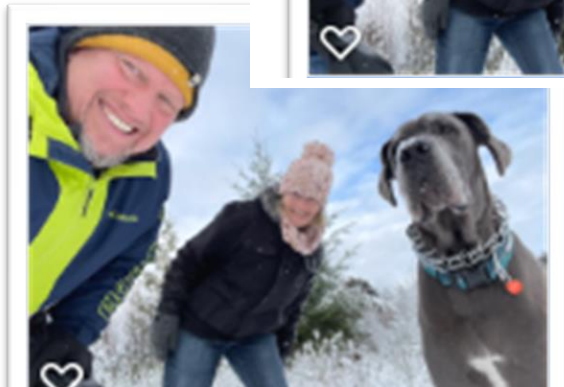
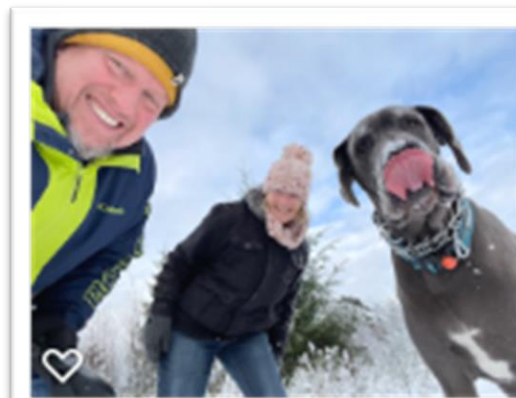
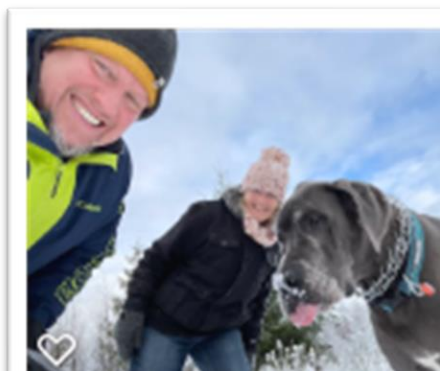
1. Listen to the weather forecast. We're on the water here and the winds can blow cold.
2. Plan ahead. Have an idea of where you'll go and let someone know.
3. Dress warmly. Dress in layers, have your hat, mittens and scarf with you and wear warm and waterproof footwear. Ears, nose, fingers and toes lose heat fastest.
4. Seek shelter. 'Nuff said.
5. Stay dry. Wet clothing chills the body rapidly.
6. Keep active. Walk, run, snowshoe etc. We have lots of trails here.
7. Be aware. Know the signs of frostbite and hypothermia and what to do.

What Exactly is Deep Bay?

Deep Bay is an unincorporated area on the east coast of Vancouver Island, in British Columbia, Canada across Baynes Sound from Denman Island which has a government marina in a naturally protected harbour. It is situated on Highway 19A north of Qualicum Beach between Fanny Bay and Bowser.

The June 23, 1946 Vancouver Island earthquake shocked the Strait of Georgia region, causing the bottom of Deep Bay to sink between 2.7 m (9 ft) and 25.6 m (84 ft). This, in part, is why the spit offers such great swimming!
